
Getting started with CAMS ⇒


The amendment request should be used to request changes requiring prior CFI approval. All other changes to the infrastructure from what was initially described in the proposal must be described in the final financial report.




Expanded eligibility




Available funds

Review process

- Similar approach for Midterm and Applications
- One expert committee per facility
- For application for extension, a single chair will manage the three committees
- Single-stage review process unless there are significant financial constraints
- Recommendations to CFI Board for funding decision in Nov 2019



Expert committee members

- 4-8 members
- 1-2 repeat members from 2017
- Expert committee members:
 - subject matter experts
 - governance and management
 - familiar with knowledge translation and transfer





SUGGEST

- Individuals qualified to evaluate governance, management and financial oversight, research enabled by the facility, and outcomes and impacts...
- · ...with a diverse lens
- Individuals from similar international facilities

Suggested reviewers




AVOID

- Direct involvement in facility governance or management
 - Advisory board members
 - Co-publishers / Coinvestigators

Expert committee meetings

- In person meetings
- Half to full day
- Q&A session with facility representatives (in person or virtual)
- Major funding partners will be invited to observe






Outcome

Funding recommendation(s) will depend on competition budget constraints

What if?

- 1. There are minor budgetary constraints?
- 2. There are major budgetary constraints?
- 3. A facility is not funded?



For the facilities funded for 5-years: Assuming satisfactory progress, the money is there for the full 5-year period at the level that was awarded in the 2017 competition.
